Discipline Policy

“Discipline is the slow step by step time consuming task of making a child see the sense in behaving in a certain manner.”- Dr. Grace Mitchell

It is the policy of LCDC to incorporate developmentally appropriate practices in regard to discipline. The purpose of discipline as stated above is to help children learn self-control, Christian attitudes, understanding the feelings of others which enables them to work and play with others.

We believe and teach that each child is special to God and to the teachers. Believing this we use positive reinforcement, redirection, and modeling to shape the child's behavior. We expect age-appropriate behavior and work with developmental guidelines.

No corporal punishment will be administered to children by the director, teachers or staff of LCDC.

The primary form of discipline is redirection. Modeling specific language and offering choices or changing the environment are other techniques that will be used to promote self-regulation and help children learn to manage their emotions and behavior. For extreme inappropriate behavior the parent will be contacted. Changes in behavior occur most successfully when parent and teacher work together to provide consistency in techniques for helping children towards the goal of self-regulation.
